SELF-MONITORING

Self-monitoring is for people who do not have symptoms, but there is a small chance they could have come into contact with a sick individual, such as being at the airport or a restaurant at the same time as someone who was diagnosed with COVID-19. If you're asked to self-monitor you should:

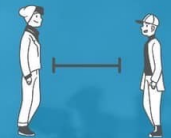
- Practice social distancing.
- Check and record your temperature 2 times a day and watch for symptoms.
- If symptoms develop, stay home and CALL your doctor to explain symptoms and possible exposure.
